June 2022 Federal Register Update

AIPI tracked the following Federal Register notices affecting Indian Country for the month of June 2022. This list includes notices published between May 23, 2022 and June 24, 2022.

1. Audit Standards

- Published June 1, 2022
- The National Indian Gaming Commission promulgated Part 571.12 establishing audit standards for tribal gaming facilities. On July 27, 2009, the Commission amended the regulation to allow tribes with multiple facilities to consolidate their audit statements into one and to allow operations earning less than \$2 million in gross gaming revenue to file an abbreviated statement.
- The proposed amendments to the Audit standards are designed to reduce the financial hurdles that small and charitable gaming operations face regarding the audit requirement.
- Interested parties are invited to participate in this proposed rulemaking by submitting such written data, views, or arguments as they may desire. Comments providing the factual basis behind supporting the views and suggestions presented are particularly helpful in developing reasoned regulatory decisions on the proposal.

- 4. <u>Migratory Bird Hunting: Proposed Migratory Bird Hunting Regulations on Certain</u> <u>Federal Indian Reservations and Ceded Lands for the 2022-23 Season</u>
 - Published on June 14, 2022.
 - The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service proposes special migratory bird hunting regulations for certain Tribes on Federal Indian reservations, off-reservation trust lands, and ceded lands for the 2022-23 migratory bird hunting season. Poosible guidelines may include:
 - On-reservation hunting by both Tribal and non-Tribal members, with hunting by non-Tribal members on some reservations to take place within Federal frameworks but on dates different from those selected by the surrounding State(s).
 - On-reservation hunting by Tribal members only, outside of the usual Federal frameworks for season dates and length, and for daily bag and possession limits.



- Off-reservation hunting by Tribal members on ceded lands, outside of usual framework dates and season length, with some added flexibility in daily bag and possession limits.

- 5. <u>Agency Information Collection Activities; Submission to the Office of Management</u> <u>and Budget (OMB) for Review and Approval; Comment Request; Tribal Broadband</u> <u>Connectivity Program</u>
 - Published on June 14, 2022.
 - The Department of Commerce is submitting its information collection request for information from grant recipients to review progress toward completing project activities and achieving core purposes of the Tribal Broadband Connectivity Program (TBCP) and to ensure compliance with TBCP requirements.
 - Public comments were previously requested via the Federal Register on February 17, 2022 during a 60-day comment period. This notice allows for an additional 30 days for public comments.

6. <u>Notice of Intent To Establish a Tribal Intergovernmental Advisory Committee;</u> <u>Request for Comments on Committee Structure</u>

- This notice announces HUD's intention to form the Department's first standing Tribal advisory committee. The committee will be called the `Tribal Intergovernmental Advisory Committee' (TIAC). This notice also solicits comments and recommendations regarding the establishment and structure of the TIAC. The TIAC will be made up of a diverse group of duly elected Tribal leaders representing small, medium, and large federally recognized Tribes. The TIAC is intended to further communications between HUD and federally recognized Tribes on HUD programs, make recommendations to HUD regarding current program regulations, provide advice in the development of HUD's American Indian and Alaska Native (AIAN) housing priorities, and encourage



peer learning and capacity building among Tribes and non-Tribal entities. Consistent with HUD's Tribal Government-to-Government Consultation Policy, this notice solicits input on the proposed structure of the TIAC.
