

# 2.5 GHz Tribal Priority Window

A Practical Guide to Applying

#### **Areas Covered**

## Who is eligible

- Any federally recognized Tribe or Alaska Native Village or a consortia of federally recognized Tribes or Alaskan Native Villages on rural Tribal lands
  - Includes Hawaiian Home Lands
  - Rural means it is not part of a Census-defined urbanized area or an urban cluster with 50,000 or greater population
  - Includes certain off-reservation lands previously designated by the Commission as eligible Tribal lands under FCC rules
- Communications providers and other entities that provide communications that are owned and controlled by federally-recognized Tribes or a consortium of such Tribes.
- Tribal Colleges and Universities
- Local presence

#### When does the window open

- The Tribal Priority Window will open on Feb. 3, 2020
- The Window will close on August 3, 2020
- Do not miss the filing window
- Important to note: The Tribal window includes only unassigned EBS spectrum

## What is the application process

- Wireless Telecommunications Bureau will announce procedures for the Tribal priority window through Public Notices
- ONAP, NCAI and a number of sources will be doing outreach to ensure potentially eligible Tribal applicants are of the specific requirements.
- FCC has not released specific procedures but based on past experiences:
  - General licensing
    - FCC Registration Number (FRN)
    - Electronic application process in the Universal Licensing System (ULS)
    - Proof of qualifying ownership
  - LPFM context
    - FCC Form 318

## What are the requirements

- Build out requirements include:
  - 50 percent population coverage within 2 years
  - 80 percent coverage within 5 years
- Penalties include loss of license and accelerated build out timelines (4 years)
